PETITION FOR RELIEF FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE OKLAHOMA OPEN RECORDS ACT

Plaintiffs Whitney Bryen and Oklahoma Watch, Inc. (collectively, "Plaintiffs"), by and through undersigned counsel, petition this Court pursuant to the Oklahoma Open Records Act ("ORA"), Okla. Stat. tit. 51 §§ 24A.1–24A.33, for:

- (1) an order declaring that the records and information requested by Plaintiffs are public records as defined by Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.8(A)(3);
- (2) an order compelling Defendant Ponca City (hereinafter "Defendant") to permit the inspection and copying of certain public records in the custody or control of the city or its agent pursuant to Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.8(A) or to otherwise produce such information now and going forward; and
- (3) an order, pursuant to Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.17(A)(2), awarding Plaintiffs reasonable attorney fees.

In support of this Petition, Plaintiffs allege and state the following:

PARTIES

1. Plaintiff Oklahoma Watch, Inc. ("Oklahoma Watch") is a nonprofit news corporation with its principal place of business in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, that produces in-

depth and investigative journalism as a public service for the benefit of all Oklahomans. Oklahoma Watch makes its content freely and openly available to the public through various mediums, including its website (oklahomawatch.org), social media platforms, newsletters, and more.

- 2. Plaintiff Whitney Bryen ("Bryen") is an award-winning investigative reporter and multimedia journalist for Oklahoma Watch, where she covers a variety of topics, including the unusually high rate at which people die in Oklahoma's jails. The state's jail inmate mortality rate is among the highest in the United States¹.
- 3. Defendant Ponca City is a city incorporated in the state of Oklahoma and situated in Kay County, Oklahoma.
- 4. The Ponca City Police Department ("PCPD") is authorized by, created by, and under the control of Defendant Ponca City. Okla. Stat. Ann. tit. 11, § 10-119.
- 5. Defendant Ponca City is a "public body" within the meaning of and subject to the ORA. See Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.3.
- 6. PCPD is a "law enforcement agency" under Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.8(1) and it maintains custody of the records sought by Plaintiffs.

THE OPEN RECORDS LAW

- 7. The purpose of the ORA is "to ensure and facilitate the public's right of access to and review of government records so they may efficiently and intelligently exercise their inherent political power." Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.2.
- 8. "Unless a record falls within a statutorily prescribed exemption in the [ORA], the record must be made available for public inspection." Citizens Against Taxpayer Abuse, Inc. v. City of Oklahoma City, 2003 OK 65, ¶12, 73 P.3d 871, 875.

- 9. "The public body urging an exemption [to disclosure] has the burden to establish the applicability of such exemption." *Id*.
- 10. "Because of the strong public policy allowing public access to governmental records," the ORA's provisions must be construed "to allow access unless an exception *clearly* applies" *Okla. Ass'n of Broads., Inc. v. City of Norman*, 2016 OK 119, ¶15, 390 P.3d 689, 694 (2016) (emphasis added).
- 11. In no uncertain terms, the ORA requires law enforcement agencies like PCPD to "make available for public inspection and copying" certain records including, but not limited to, "a chronological list of all incidents, including offense report information showing the offense, date, time, general location, officer, and *a brief summary of what occurred*,... facts concerning the arrest, including the cause of the arrest and the name of the arresting officer," and "radio logs, including a chronological listing of the calls dispatched." Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.8(A) (emphasis added).
- 12. "Except where specific state or federal statutes create a confidential privilege, persons who submit information to public bodies have no right to keep this information from public access nor reasonable expectation that this information will be kept from public access." Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.2 (emphasis added).
- 13. Beyond the enumerated information that must be made public pursuant to § 24A.8(A), law enforcement agencies must provide access to records when a court finds that the public interest in disclosure outweighs the law enforcement agency's justification for denying the public access to a public record. Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.8(B).

THE OFFENDER DATA INFORMATION SYSTEM (ODIS)

- 14. PCPD regularly maintains public records regarding arrests using the Offender Data Information System ("ODIS"), a law enforcement and municipal court records management application that "has been designed using web-based technology in order to provide an easily upgradeable, networked records management tool for statewide information connectivity for the participating agencies." *See* Offender Data Information System, OKLAHOMA STATE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION, https://osbi.ok.gov/services/law-enforcement-programs/odis# (last accessed January 22, 2023).
 - 15. More than 300 law enforcement agencies in Oklahoma use ODIS.²
- 16. PCPD uses ODIS to retain information specifically enumerated as public records in § 24A.8(A) and to produce arrest reports in response to open records requests.
- 17. Such reports are comprised of discrete ODIS fields into which a police officer inputs information concerning an arrest and arrestee.
- 18. Among the available ODIS information fields is a narrative section (hereinafter the "Narrative"), in which an officer can summarize the events that transpired during an arrest.
- 19. Upon information and belief, the Narrative is the only part of an ODIS-generated arrest report in which an officer can briefly summarize what occurred during an arrest—there is no alternative section of an ODIS arrest report that might constitute what the ORA refers to as a "brief summary of what occurred." Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.8(B)(A)(3).
- 20. Upon information and belief, the ODIS platform enables PCPD to include or exclude any ODIS information field from an arrest report, including the Narrative.

- 21. Upon information and belief, PCPD uses the ODIS platform in a manner that excludes the Narrative from every arrest report produced pursuant to an open records request.
- 22. In response to open records requests, Plaintiffs regularly receive arrest reports that include the Narrative from other Oklahoma law enforcement agencies.
- 23. Arrest report Narrative sections received from other Oklahoma law enforcement agencies and reviewed by Plaintiffs typically range in word count from 20 to 2000 words. Examples of arrest reports containing the Narrative that have previously been provided to Plaintiffs pursuant to open record requests are attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- 24. The Narrative in an arrest report is a crucial source of information for journalists who report on police activity because it contextualizes the other information contained in the report and allows an officer to summarize events that cannot be reduced to the data points in other ODIS information fields that comprise an arrest report.
- 25. The Narrative can be redacted when necessary and does not typically include unsworn witness statements.
 - 26. The Narrative is not created by, or specifically for, attorneys.

THE RECORDS AT ISSUE

- 27. Patrick James Hansen was arrested on July 27, 2022, by Ponca City police on allegations of child abuse and domestic violence.
- 28. Following standard policy, PCPD input information regarding Hansen's arrest into ODIS, where it still exists.
- 29. Hansen was booked into the Kay County Detention Center, where he remained incarcerated from the date of his arrest until his death at the facility on September 12, 2022. He was 39 years old.

- 30. Hansen's death was the second at the Kay County Detention Center in as many months, occurring mere weeks after another inmate died at the facility in July 2022.
- 31. On July 19, 2023, Bryen, in her role as a reporter for Oklahoma Watch, submitted a request via PCPD's online record request form for "the most recent arrest report for Patrick James Hansen (hereinafter "the Request"). A true and correct copy of the Request is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.
- 32. On July 20, 2023, PCPD Office Specialist Dolley M. Rolland responded to Bryen's Request by phone, stating that PCPD could produce the Hansen arrest report but that it would not include a Narrative section. When Bryan asked why, Rolland referred her to Assistant City Attorney John Andrew.
- 33. City Attorney Andrew informed Bryen that the Narrative was exempt from disclosure under the ORA. He agreed to provide her with a copy of the arrest report, albeit one without the Narrative section.
- 34. PCPD sent Bryen the arrest report with the Narrative removed on July 20, 2023, but unbeknownst to Bryen, the email was caught by her email account's spam filter and went undetected for several months.
- 35. Bryen followed up with PCPD regarding her Request on October 9, 2023. Later that day, she received via email another copy of Patrick James Hansen's July 2022 arrest report (the "Hansen Report"). Rolland's email transmitting the Hansen Report and the report itself are attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.
- 36. The Hansen Report is a seven-page document generated from ODIS and includes fields for details about Hansen's arrest including the subject, the victim, witnesses, and the offense.

- 37. The Hansen Report does not include the Narrative section containing a brief summary of events that transpired during Hansen's July 2022 arrest.
- 38. As of the date of this filing, Plaintiffs have not received the Narrative section of the Hansen Report responsive to Bryen's Request.
- 39. Members of the Ponca City Police Department and other Ponca City officials, having conspired to perpetrate a violation of the Oklahoma Open Records Act, intend to continue such violation now and in the future by withholding the Narrative sections from all arrest reports produced in response to open record requests, including the arrest report at issue in this case, in violation of the plain language of the statute.

CAUSE OF ACTION

Violation of the ORA for Unlawful Withholding of Records Responsive to Plaintiffs' Request

- 40. Plaintiffs repeat, reallege, and incorporate the allegations set forth in paragraphs 1 through 39 as though fully set forth herein.
 - 41. PCPD possesses the Narrative absent from the Hansen Report in ODIS.
- 42. The Narrative segment of Hansen's ODIS arrest record is a record of a public body and law enforcement agency, as defined by the plain language of the ORA. Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.3.
- 43. The Narrative segment of Hansen's ODIS arrest record is a "brief summary of what occurred" during Hansen's July 27, 2022 arrest and PCPD is obligated to produce it to the public upon request. Okla. Stat. tit. 51, § 24A.8(A).
- 44. The Narrative segment of Hansen's ODIS arrest record is responsive to Bryen's Request.

- 45. There is no legal basis for Defendant's failure to disclose the Narrative segment of Hansen's ODIS arrest record to Plaintiffs in response to the Request.
- 46. Disclosure of the Narrative, in this instance and others, will enable Plaintiffs, in their capacity as members of the news media, to evaluate whether those entrusted with enforcing the law are honestly, faithfully, and competently performing their duties as public servants.
- 47. Disclosure of the Narrative segment of Hansen's ODIS arrest record is in the public interest.
- 48. Defendant has violated the ORA by unlawfully withholding the Narrative summary of the arrest and will continue to violate the ORA absent relief from this Court.

REQUESTED RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court:

- A. Declare that the Narrative segment of Hansen's arrest record is a brief summary of what occurred during the arrest and is therefore a public record and subject to disclosure under the ORA;
- B. Declare that the public interest in the requested record outweighs any reason to deny Plaintiffs the Narrative segment of Hansen's arrest record;
- C. Declare that Defendant's refusal and failure to provide the requested record is an unlawful violation of the Oklahoma Open Records Act;
- D. Grant an injunction and/or issue a writ of mandamus compelling Defendant to (i) permit the inspection and copying of the Narrative segment of Hansen's arrest record; and (ii) produce the Narrative sections of arrest reports in response to open record requests now and in the future;

- E. Award Plaintiffs reasonable attorney fees and the costs of this action, pursuant to Okla. Stat. tit. 51 § 24A.17(A)(2); and
 - F. Grant such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.

The next morning when VI came too AR told her he was going to take care of her the next 2-3 weeks while she healed up. AR was afraid she would call the police and did not want her to. VI told him she just wanted to go home. AR texted VI's work to tell them she would not be in today. VI convinced AR to have him take her to VI's home to collect some things and get her dogs. AR loaded VI into VI's car and they went to her home. AR got a tub and loaded some things VI needed. AR allowed VI to wash her face there. They then went back to AR's home where he pulled VI's car into the garage. This was sometime in the morning of 06/07/2022. VI laid on the floor in pain. VI felt like she was going to die.

Around 2100 hours AR put her tub of stuff back in VI's car. He took VI to the office room and showed her a new bottle of Whiskey he bought and multiple pill bottles. AR told VI he was not going to be here the next morning and she was free to leave. VI left AR's house in her vehicle. This was the last time she had contact with AR. VI went to Medical in Edmond where a nurse contact the police.

I contacted LT. Brown to advise him of this call. Hefner officers assisted with going to AR's home and detaining him. For more

information on contact with AR, view other officers' reports under this case number.

VI participated in the Domestic Violence Risk Assessment. She stated she was willing to press charges and wanted to be as helpful as possible.

I took photographs of VI's clothes in the hospital room. VI stated the blue shirt was the shirt SU shoved in her mouth, gaging her. It had blood on the shirt. I also took pictures of VI for evidence. VI had visible injuries on both eyes, both arms appeared to be swollen, bruising to her back side, blood shot eyes, and marks on both sides of her neck. These photographs were taken with my city issued phone and uploaded via the AXON CAPTURE APP under this case number. The Blue T-shirt used to gag VI was later booked in at the Oklahoma City Property Room under this case number for evidence. It was placed in the small item drop.

Detectives were called out for this incident. I transported VI to HQ to be interviewed. VI's friend followed. The interview was completed and I transported VI to hospital hospital hospital At the hospital VI signed a ticket against AR for A&B (Ticket # 191901195).

with the case number and a Domestic Violence Pamphlet. I left the hospital.

I went to the Oklahoma City Property Room and booked in the evidence.

I informed Ms. Milano I cant do any of that. After I told her I couldn't she began to get upset and yell and then get calm again.

After arriving at Norman Reginal hospital Ms. Milano refused to get out of the vehicle. I went inside and asked a staff member if they had a wheel chair to bring Ms. Milano inside and she was refusing to get out of my car. A member of the hospital staff followed me out to my vehicle with a wheelchair and attempted to try and get Ms. Milano out of my car. After several attempts with the hospital staff member Ms. Milano still refused to get out of the vehicle. The hospital staff went back inside and brought other members out to assist with getting Ms. Milano out of the vehicle. Hospital staff was able to get Ms. Milano out of my car and escort her inside the hospital. After getting inside the hospital Ms. Milano began to yell some more. Nurses escorted Ms. Milano to a hospital room where she was checked out by medical personal and was cleared for incarceration. As we where waiting for paperwork from the hospital, Ms. Milano began to yell "Amber Alert" causing hospital staff and security to come to the room. I gathered my paperwork and escorted Ms. Milano to my vehicle where she refused to get in the vehicle and sit down. Hospital Security was able to get Ms. Milano into my patrol vehicle. I was about to put the seat belt on Ms. Milano and I asked her if she was going to bite me. Ms. Milano then imitated as if she was going to bite me. I informed her if she bites me it was going to be another charge. I was able to get the seat belt buckled and Ms. Milano secured in my vehicle.

I was enroute to CCDC with Ms. Milano when she said she was gagging. I pulled over in the Braums parking lot to check on Ms. Milano and make sure she wasn't going to throw up. I got out of my vehicle, opened my patrol door, when Ms. Milano spit out side the vehicle. I asked her if was doing better and she spit again. I then closed my door and proceeded to CCDC. Ms. Milano continued to yell and have mood swings of anger and calm.

After arriving at CCDC I went to get Ms. Milano out of my vehicle and informed her again not to bite me. As I was reaching down to unbuckle the seat belt Ms. Milano leaned forward towards me. I used my left forearm and placed it against Ms. Milano upper chest area, causing her to brace against the back seat of my vehicle and told her do not try legs out of the vehicle. I asked Ms. Milano to get out of my vehicle. Ms. Milano asked for me to assist her with getting her legs out of the vehicle. I assisted Ms. Milano's legs out of the vehicle where she was able to get herself out of the vehicle. I escorted Ms. Milano in to the booking area of CCDC, where she was released to staff and booked on a list of district charges. CCDC staff located Medical marijuana inside Ms. Milano's purse, I transported it to the Noble Police Department where it was booked in for safe keeping in property locker #7.

After arriving the police department I contacted Ms. Haubold over the telephone and asked her if Ms. Milano had permission to be inside her residence. Ms. Haubold informed me she did not have permission to be inside her residence. Ms. Haubold said she is worried about MS. Milano because she is obsessed with her son, Juvenile
