ORDER

The Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press, the Associated Press, Compass, Contemporary Media, Inc., Courthouse News Service, the E.W. Scripps Company, Gannett Co., Inc., Lee Enterprises, Inc., Memphis Fourth Estate, Inc. d/b/a The Daily Memphian, MLK50: Justice Through Journalism, the National Press Club, the National Press Club Journalism Institute, The New York Times Company, TEGNA Inc., the Tennessee Association of Broadcasters, the Tennessee Coalition for Open Government, and the Tennessee Press Association (collectively, “Amici”), proceeding as *amici curiae* in this appeal, have filed a motion asking to cede seven minutes of The Nashville Banner’s time for oral argument to counsel for Amici.
